

History The Romans



Throughout this unit of work our main focus will be to learn about The Romans and the huge impact that they had and still have on life in Britain. We will begin exploring where the Roman Empire began and how The Romans invaded Europe. We will explore the invasions of both Julius Caesar and Claudius and discuss the significance of these. Part of our unit will also look at the famous Celtic Queen-Boudicca. We will understand how perspectives of her rebellion may differ depending on the different sources we look at. Finally, we will explore how key features such as transport and architecture changed as a result of Romans being in Britain. What an interesting bunch to learn about!

RE Our RE learning this half term will be focused around creation and the key question we will explore is 'What do Christians learn from the creation story?



Music During our music sessions this half term we will be developing pulse and groove through improvisation and will explore a wide range of different music including genres such as Pop, Folk and Jazz. We will be discussing a key question 'How does music improve our world?'

Maths

This term we will learn about dividing by 10 and 100, considering what happens to the digits in the place value columns. Next, we will learn about hundredths, money and short multiplication methods. We will be comparing and classifying geometric shapes and identifying lines of symmetry. Linking with our History unit, we will also be learning how to read Roman numerals up to 100. We will be continuing to learn out times tables up to 12×12 .

Science

We begin our topic discovering what sound is, thinking about vibrations and learning that sound is a form of energy that travels through a medium. We continue to discover how we hear by looking at the parts of the ear and how sounds are interpreted by the brain. Children look at sound waves. identifying their parts and discover the life and work of Alexander Graham Bell, uncovering his significance. Next, we explore what pitch is and how it can differ finding exploring patterns of vibrations. We conclude with looking at volume and how this can be changed.





During our artwork this half term we will be exploring sculpture. We will begin by looking at the artist Barbara Hepworth. Later on we explore 'sgraffito' and study Roman pot designs. We explore relief printing, coil and pinching techniques and use all we have design and make learnt to our own Roman pots.



French

This French unit is titled 'La Famille'. This unit enables us to tell others the names and ages of members of their own or a fictional family in French. We will continue to count in French working towards reaching 100.

Computing

We will use the programme 'Scratch' to explore how we can use a range of different variables to achieve a specific goal. The children will make choices about the games they would like to create.

Jigsaw PSHE This term Jigsaw piece is 'Dreams and Goals. We consider our hopes and dreams for the future and discuss strategies for handling disappointment.
