Home Learning Ideas

- Plant some seeds and watch them grow! Create a plant diary to record the changes you see. Try putting some plants in different places, to investigate how their growth is affected.
- Create a flower sculpture using different materials. You could use Lego, stones in the garden, pasta shapes. Be as creative as you can with your materials.
- Make your own 'dragon machine', using junk modelling materials. Write a set of instructions for someone else to make one too.
- Visit the beach, a local coastline or Poole Harbour. Take photos of the features you spot. Can you compare the different places you visit?
- Create a map of a place you know well. This could be your house, garden, local
 park or another place you visit often. Try and add symbols and a key for the
 features of your chosen place.
- Make a painting or drawing in the style of Georgia O'Keeffe. Zoom into your chosen flower and use bright colours.
